VC37**Statement of nature and key elements of landscape**

The Quarry Hills form a significant and distinctive 'non urban break' between the South Morang and Mernda growth areas. The hills provide visual relief and interest and have high aesthetic, flora and fauna and heritage conservation values.

VC37**Landscape character objective to be achieved**

The landscape character objective is to maintain and enhance the existing rural character and unimpeded views to the hills by:

- Encouraging development to locate in the foothills below the contour specified within the South Morang Local Structure Plan;
- Seeking to minimise visual and built form intrusion into the natural environment;
- Supporting the appropriate siting of dwellings and other structures within the Quarry Hills area;
- Discouraging inappropriate industries or other commercial uses from locating within the Quarry Hills area;
- Encouraging the re-establishment of indigenous vegetation;
- Minimising native vegetation removal.

3.019/01/2006
VC37**Permit requirement**

An application for planning permit must be accompanied by a report or plans, as appropriate, which detail:

- Any works necessary to control drainage and stormwater runoff from all buildings, access roads and driveways.
- The location, extent and levels of any excavations or alterations to the natural surface, including details of works to stabilise areas of fill or excavation.
- The capacity of the land to accommodate the proposed development having regard to the disposal of sewage, sullage and effluent on site.
- Measures to reduce the visual impact of any buildings or works including landscaping and details regarding materials and finishes.
- Areas for the reinstatement/regeneration of native vegetation.

VC37**Decision guidelines**

Before deciding on an application the responsible authority must consider the purpose and decision guidelines of the relevant underlying zone.

Before deciding on an application to remove, destroy or lop vegetation the responsible authority must consider:

- The conservation and enhancement of the area including visual amenity.
- Preservation of, and impact on the natural environment and the need to prevent erosion.
- The preservation and protection of significant vegetation and habitat.
- The management of vegetation to minimise fire hazard.
